

and further that ¹⁸⁸communications in case of
emergency either to the Indians or to Government
be made by the Committee having the immediate
charge of the Concern and that the contingent
fund desired for carrying on the Concern be
placed in the hands of the Treasurer of the
Committee of Indiana Yearly Meeting, But that
all communications with Government should
go through the Committee of Baltimore
that they be at liberty to make such
applications without the necessity of
consulting the other Committee when the delay
would be in any degree injurious to the Con-
cern. In all cases the transactions with
the Government & the Indians to be recip-
rocally communicated to the Committee of
the respective Yearly Meeting.

The approbation
of the Government has already been obtained
to carry into effect the foregoing plan & we
expect that our friends of Ohio & Indiana will
enter without delay upon measures for its
accomplishment.

(No visit has been paid to
the Indians under our care since that in the
Spring of 1833 noted above But our friends
of Ohio & Indiana on whom rest the active
duties of this Concern have received information
that they were likely to suffer furnished them

with relief by a supply ¹⁸⁹ of Provisions forwarded
to the care of the Agent of the Government
to be distributed amongst them)

Joseph King junior treasurer of our
Committee is authorised by us & by the Committee
of Ohio & Indiana Yearly Meeting to receive
the whole or any part of the Amount of the funds
mentioned in your communication of the 8th
last when advised he will draw for such
Amount as you may authorize & care will
be taken to have it applied in the manner
you may direct.

The information appears due
from us to friends of Great Britain in relation
to the funds heretofore received from them by
Baltimore Yearly Meeting for Indian Civilization.
In the year 1821 an agreement was entered
into by the Yearly Meetings of Baltimore & Ohio
that the active duties of the Concern of Indian
Civilization should devolve on the Yearly Meeting
of Ohio in conjunction with friends of Indians
that the funds remain in Baltimore subject
to the Draft of the Committee of Ohio Yearly Meeting
as far as was necessary to defray the expenses
of the Operations of the Committee; The Committee
of Baltimore Yearly Meeting retaining an
interest in the Concern were whenever necessary
to appear on behalf of the objects of our Concern.
