The letter alluded to from the superintendent states that  
the Shawnee has agreed to the propositions of the  
Government alluded to in the Report of our Deputation  
and has signed an article to that effect to be laid  
before Congress.

The latter further states that the Indians  
informed the Methodist Missionary that he might leave  
them to go among the lower Indians and the Baptist  
Missionary <sup>that</sup> he might go somewhere else where he  
might do some good, telling them at the same time  
that the Quakers had now sent a family to take  
care of them and that they were their real  
friends, and would provide for them in the way of education  
all that they were in need of. Dear friends, we

believe it right to inform you that the wages of a super-  
intendent & wife is 500 \$ per annum for two years the term  
for which they are employed that of a Deacon about  
240 \$ a year and a young woman 100 \$ per annum,  
to which add the whole expenses of the property  
furnished, freight of the same, expense of removing the  
family & of the Deputation to the Indians take expense  
that we have been at & all will see that a heavy  
draught has been made on our resources. The  
whole amount on hand at our last yearly meeting

including the Donations <sup>209</sup> of Dr. Muthank & friends  
in England was a little over \$4000 dollars out  
of which every expense had to be defrayed for the  
past year.

In taking into consideration the many  
interesting concerns at this time and the compressed  
the Indians have in us as their real friends we  
would suggest to you (with ourselves) whether it would  
not seem right on submitting this account to our  
Seasonal Yearly Meetings respectively to encourage  
a liberal contribution of funds the ensuing year  
in order to enable us to continue this benevolent work  
the expense of which will be much lightened as  
the farm comes to be in a state of cultivation.
