to do what we can for those of the Shawnee &
their children who do not leave the settlement
being encouraged to believe that by a prudent
watchful & faithful exertion on the part of our
Superintendent this opportunity to make
the best use of the opportunities still remaining
we shall realize for these objects of our Benevolence
nearly the same amount of good as was anticipated
in the first instance & before the present interruption

we perceive by the reports of the Proceedings
of Congress that a resolution has been introduced
by one of its Members & adopted which contains
express reference to this subject & this will perhaps
place the question before them in such a light
as to show the necessity of our interference

With these views expressed in brotherly
freedom we retain the Memorial in our hands
