To the Com^{tee} on Indian Concerns of New York
Yearly Meeting

Dear Friends

A Report of Minutes
of your last Yearly Meeting on the subject of
Indian Concerns having been received by us has
drawn our notice & consideration

We are glad to perceive
a manifestation on your part of strong interest in the
present condition & future prospects of the most wretched
Aborigines of our Country we believe there to be prominent
Gentle objects for our sympathy & the desire
that friends seeing where we may be of service in the
pursuance of such measures for their improvement
meet as time & season may unfold each promising

that to retain the appropos is no less a part of the
Charity which is due than to give the fatherless
& pleas for the widows

We are however determined
joining you in your special concern as developed
in the Report alluded to, our hands being full with
the engagement which we are now carrying on
in conjunction with this & Indiana Yearly Meetings
for the Civilization & Education of the American
Indians: This engagement has been one of long standing
has occasioned much expenditure of money & been
the subject of much prayer: We are anxious to
continue its promotion still further and in order to do
this we shall have demands upon us for all the funds
that are likely to be placed at our disposal devoted to
purposes of this kind. Referring you to the last paragraph
of our Communication addressed to you in the
