The boys are very helpful in the farm -
 while at the same ^{time} they are receiving instruction
 in husbandry, ~~and in the~~ ^{in the} ~~management~~ ^{management} of the farm.

The wheat crop this year was very poor
 only a part of it being ^{fully} ~~totally~~ good
 & often acres failing entirely -

The oats however were very good, and the
 corn crop & the garden tolerably good.

The incidental expenses of the establishment
 were defrayed by the surplus product of
 the farm last year, but this year the
 failure of the wheat crop makes it necessary
 to look to some other source to meet them.
