

Since writing the foregoing, I have been examining the manuscript minutes of the Indiana Com. on Indian Concerns collected and copied by Schellus Pugh, that Mahalah refers to, and I have found the amended plan adopted by the Committee of Baltimore, Ohio and Indiana 1st mo 1835 at Mount Pleasant, Ohio. The opening clause is as follows;

Plan of Future Operations.

"That the concern of the Civilization of the Shawnee Indians, who have been heretofore under our care, and who have removed, and are now living on the Kansas River, be carried on by the three Yearly Meetings of Baltimore, Ohio, and Indiana, and that the active part of the business devolve on the Committee of Indiana Yearly Meeting, with such assistance from the Committee of Ohio Yearly Meeting as they may be enabled to afford"

Another clause is, "And that the contingent funds, designed for carrying on the concern, be placed in the care of the Treasurer of the Committee of Indiana Yearly Meeting."
