

~~A paper in 1808 later we find them opening an~~
~~Establishment among these Indians on the Wabash River~~
~~some 20 miles ^{south} west of Ft. Wayne which they continued~~
~~with made promise of success until the war of 1812 during~~
~~which it was broken up and the buildings burned.~~
 In 1810 ~~the Committee sent~~ ~~and again~~ ~~the~~ ~~we find them sending~~
 deputations to the Shawnees in ~~the~~ Western Ohio and
 and to mixed tribes on the head waters of Miami River
 at each of which places they soon supplied to the
 Indians, tools and farming implements and sent Members
 of the Society to live among them and instruct them
 in farming and the use of implements. This work ^{also} was
 interrupted by the war of 1812 - the Indians scattered
 and their settlements ^{were} desolated - but scarcely had peace
 been restored before Friends of Ohio Yearly Meeting which
 had been set off from Baltimore in 1812, sent a
 deputation to look after these Indians and in co-operation
 with Baltimore Friends ^{they} in 1816 re-opened the work at
 Waugh-pahk-anetta in Auglaize Co Ohio. and at
 Stony Creek. In 1821 Indiana Yearly Meeting was
 established, being set off from Ohio. and was invited

by Ohio Yearly Meeting to unite with the Ohio Committee
 in the direction and oversight of this work ~~and~~ and
 from this time on, the three Yearly Meetings co-operated
 - Baltimore Friends giving up to Ohio and Indiana
 Committees the general direction and management
 of the Mission, ~~and~~ but retaining possession of the
 invested funds - ~~much~~ ^{much} of which had been supplied by
 English Friends several years before - Frequent visits were
 made by members of the Indiana and Ohio Committees to
 the Shawnee Settlement or Mission - a school was opened
 and there were hopeful signs of improvement
 A proposition looking to the removal of all the Indian
 tribes to a new location beyond the Mississippi River
 was now greatly agitating most of the Tribes or Bands
 The Shawnees at Waugh-pahk-anetta and Stony Creek
 were disposed to remove, though some of them were
 opposed to the ~~proposition~~ ^{which followed greatly} and the agitation
 and discussions ~~unsettled~~ ^{unsettled} them and
^{added much to the difficulty of conducting the mission}
 In the minutes of Baltimore Committee for the
 year 1826 we find an expression of their
 satisfaction with the management and care of
