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The Annual Meeting of the Association was held at the meeting house in the evening of the 25th of 11th month 1857 and was largely attended & interest from all the Trade Unions.

The first of the preceding meeting was well and appeared.

The President read a letter from the new and previous of the Association to the present time.

The Election of Officers being in order in motion of Thomas Wilson to have Officers elected at the next meeting to continue for another year.

The Annual Report of the Association was read by the President and was acceptably received.

The Second Annual Report of the Superintendent of Education was also read. The Report was exceedingly interesting, being illustrated by drawings showing the position and number of the different School Houses in the County and Districts. The Schools have made great progress and give promise of most successful results in the future. Several of the friends of the Society were present and expressed their appreciation of the Report, and wish the success of the undertaking.

William Sampson Superintendent of the Agricultural Department addressed the meeting. He gave a full account of his observations to the State of Agriculture in N. B., and the improvement to be made for the production of means of the model farm he proposed to show to North Kentonians, that could be done with the same land by proper cultivation, and hoped by his example to excite the interest among friends upon this subject.
