A letter was sent to Marcus Mendenhall at Boarding School
with list of prices of apparatus & our views thereon, as per
letter book. Ezra M. Meader & Rebecca Marble were
accepted as teachers & directed to report to John Scott
F. J. King was directed to write to Dr. Nicholson in answer to
his letter of the 1st inst.

The Committee appointed to select & ship school-books, reported
they had done so, as per the following invoice to John Scott care

Dr Winslow, Dr Thomas, & J. C. Thomas.

F. J. King reported that the stores are now ready
& will be shipped to-morrow.

A copy of a letter to W^m Nicholson was read
& was satisfactory. A letter was received from
John Scott stating he had taken a room in Greens-
boro, to which point all letters & packages are to
be directed. An interesting letter was received
from Joseph Moore 12/30/65 stating he was able
to perform the duties of Superintendent, & would
accept the position if appointed. F. J. King was
directed to inform him that upon the return of
John Scott he would be appointed to succeed
him at with a salary of \$1000. per. year, with his
board & traveling expenses paid.

W^m J. Cox & L. J. Moore having returned to N. Carolina
we send them each \$300. as directed by the Ass^{ts}.
Joseph Grosfield having expended \$126. in relieving
six families of friends in N.C. the President is
directed to refund him this sum.

R. M. Janney & J. C. Thomas are appointed to pack
books, clothing, &c. and ship them with the stores
tomorrow to John Scott Greensboro N.C. leave of
W^m J. King Richmond Va.
