GARDEN, N. C., Eighth Month 20th, 1874.

Rutell and wife and Augustus Gaudin Trustee and his wife, conveyed five and a half acres of ~~front~~ land in that County to Francis T. King, Jesse Tyson and James Carey Thomas upon such trusts and arrangements as the Baltimore Association of Friends might at any time by their rules and regulations specify and designate:

Now it is agreed and voted as a rule and regulation in respect to said land, and we do so specify and designate, that said trustees do convey said land, in fee simple, to Allen Jay, in consideration of the sum of One dollar.

And on further record our satisfaction with the services of said Jay in connection with the work of our Association, and have passed the foregoing resolution in consideration thereof.

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
