In reply to their queries

I would state -

No system has been agreed upon as yet - we want good primary schools - must leave the character of them to the Supt. after he has examined into the systems of education as it now exists.

We presume he must build up
the system almost from its founda-
tion. The Bonding Act of '0
will go on separately.
