It is our duty
to believe to pay travelling ex-
penses to the school where a
teacher is engaged but not
from their home. We adopt
that rule.

Board is furnished by King
in N. C. & we pay the teacher
& furnish books for the pupils.
Our Dept arranges salaries ac-
cording to the size of the
school & the ability of the
teacher. He appears to give from
20¢ to 25¢ per month.

We do not wish to interfere with
his schedule of salaries but we
will engage to give thee \$5 per
month more than the same
grade of schools receive.
