Dear Joseph

I enclose thy $\frac{1}{2}$ while in our service
with interest on thy monthly salary, compoun-
ded, deducting the three pay's of \$50. \$125. \$123⁵⁸;
leaving a bal due thee of \$2768²⁵ - Nov 1. '68.

I also send thy ac on that balance, up to this date, balance due thee \$437⁶⁷, for which I enclose my check to thy order, which I think thou wilt find correct.

I had a letter from Allen Day today stating that he would open a Normal School at Grovesboro 7/10/76 & continue it for 5 weeks. Also that Rachel Franklinson had died - all the children were with her. Trinity College suspended its work, all the stores were closed & every one who could go went to her funeral at the Mtg House - she died greatly lamented & beloved. Uncle Allen is confined to the house & has been poorly for two months. Allen Day has concluded to remain in N.C., with much love thy fr^d R. T. King
