

NEW GARDEN BOARDING SCHOOL, FOR MALE AND FEMALE STUDENTS.

Located Six Miles West of Greensboro, Guilford County, North Carolina.

THE WINTER SESSION of this School for the year 1866-7 began on 12th of Eleventh Month, (November,) and will continue thirty-two weeks. The next Scholastic Year will begin Seventh Month, (July) 29th, 1867, in which there will be two sessions, a Summer Term of twelve weeks, (beginning with the Scholastic Year,) and a winter term of twenty-eight weeks, beginning Eleventh Month, (November) 11th.

BRANCHES OF STUDY.

JUNIOR DIVISION.

Reading in 2nd, 3rd and 4th Readers, Writing according to Spencerian system, Spelling, Intellectual Arithmetic, Primary, Progressive, and Practical Arithmetic with Walton's Calculating Table, English Grammar, Primary Geography, also by Charts and Natural Philosophy.

SENIOR DIVISION.

Penmanship, History, Physiology, Chemistry with practice in Apparatus Room, Geology, Physical Geography, Elocution, Algebra, Surveying, Trigonometry, Astronomy, Analytical Geometry. Instruction will also be given in the higher branches of Mathematics if desired, likewise in Latin, Greek, French, German, Italian and Spanish.

All the students are required to make one recitation each week in Scripture, and a portion of the Bible is read daily in the school. No efforts will be spared on the part of Officers of the Institution in stimulating the students to habits of zealous study, and in inculcating true and liberal views of morality and religion, but any student after due admonition, persisting in immoral conduct will be dismissed.

Board and Tuition for half term of twenty weeks, \$65, specie or equivalent. An additional charge of \$5 for Latin and Greek, or any one of the four modern languages.

Books and Stationery furnished on reasonable terms for cash. About \$1600 have recently been expended in refitting and improving the School building. Also \$750 for apparatus to illustrate different subjects in Chemistry, Natural Philosophy, Electricity, &c.

Students who pass successfully through the studies of the two divisions of our School will receive a printed Certificate with the signatures of the immediate Officers of the Institution, and of all the Trustees attached.

The School is now under the direction of A. Marshall Elliott, A. B. and Mary E. Harris as Principals in their respective departments, with Jonathan E. Cox and Elizabeth, his wife as Superintendents.

Weekly Lectures will be delivered on subjects connected with the course of study.
