amount in summer months & to be in
two yearly drafts that tract of
land that the said William Richardson
Francis enjoys the same for the space of
three years free of any rent or ~~cost~~
interest with the privilege of buying
the same at any time during the period
at each
That if the said William Richardson Francis
fail to purchase said land and improve
the same and the same shall not be wanted
for the use of friends of Northgate
then the same may be sold and the
