2nd Mo 1st Returned to Greensboro found a note from Joseph who had got through with the Schools at Centre and had gone to Marlboro. found letters from James Rastin.

2nd Left again for Highpoint on my way to Pine Woods where I arrived on the 3rd. Spent the night with David Mosfit, who gave me a correct account of the children within the limits of that meeting, being twelve who are Members & twenty whose parents are or have been Members who are entitled to the same privileges as Members & those who are Members. I therefore informed them we would pay them twenty dollars per 100 towards getting them a teacher as they had the offer of one who they thought would be suitable at 25 dollars per Month and he heard himself attended Pine Woods Mtg on Sat day the 4th. The house very much out of repair, about fifty percent. Returned to A. M. Townshens place a Mtg for worship at Bush Hill where I met with Joseph there who had returned from his work of examining Schools in Centre & Marlboro Mtgs. Second day Morning 5th Settled with Franklin

Blair for one Month Teaching a school at Oak Forest within the limits of Springfield North Mtg. He reported five dollars received for tuition & I paid him twenty dollars which was in full for the Mo Salary, agreeing to pay him at the rate of thirty dollars per 100 for the balance of the term.

Also settled with Alpheus L. Mendenhall for one Month Service as teacher in the School at Springfield North Mtg. He reported seven dollars half tuition fees, which left a balance due him of twenty seven & half dollars due him which I gave him & took receipt for thirty five dollars being the amount agreed upon. returned to Greensboro, where Joseph there gave an account of his visit to the Schools visited by him. He visited three Schools in Centre ~~but~~ taught by two of Aron Staulhens daughters the other by David. farlow numbering 88 children in the three Schools. He also visited seven Schools in the limits of Marlboro numbering 194 children. School He did not visit but learned there was 35 children on the roll. Wrote some letters & filled up our Journals the balance of the day.
