also promised to assist them in paying her for the
~~present~~ term, there appears to be four to five children
in this neighborhood. The school is near William &
Outland & Eli C. Coplands.

In another neighborhood known as James W. Copland
there is twenty six children they are anxious for a
school here. Joseph Moore was in treaty with a young
man Gordon Brown to take charge of a school here.

And in Jonathan Coplands ^{neighborhood} which is about five miles
from the Meeting have in another direction there
twenty children which makes ninety eight chil-
dren within the limits of Richsquam Mo Meeting,
who has as yet had no help in the education of his
children nor very little in other respects, there is
however two friends who want some clothing viz. tall
Bundys Gordon Brown, good strong common clothing
that will keep them warm, This much for Richsquam
Monthly Meeting.

In Piney Woods Mo Meeting they have a Quarterly
Meeting School and are building a school house which
they expect to be ready by the fourth of next month
for a school to be opened. ~~Rebecca~~ ^{Rebecca} Washfield is in wait-
ing to take charge of it, as I have given up the Super-
intendency to Joseph Moore I feel released from visiting
this Mo Meeting. Have met however with quite a
