Thy letter of the 22nd inst was duly received & laid before some of the members of the Exec. Com. It has been decided to pay the salary of a teacher near Goldstons for three months if the school is kept open nine months in the year: also to furnish the help asked for the school at Dover; namely, to pay half the expense of keeping the school open for two months longer than the public funds will carry it.

In regard to thy request in thy letter of the 19th inst. for general instructions about promising aid to schools under the control of Friends, the decision of the Exec. Com. is that where the schools needing help are under the control of Friends, & are under their care, & benefit at least six Friend children, they can extend the time of such aid to two months. We wish thee however to get some aid
