

of our Com. as to the needs of the work, & afterwards a few amendments were suggested to make the Report better for publication.

Our position is a very responsible one. We were asked to take charge of the funds from England & Ireland for the very reason that we had been so careful of their contributions after the war, & they expect from us now again a detailed statement of what we do.

We have not received a dollar from any American party. We only received a remittance within a week from Ireland amounting to \$600. We have a remittance from England, which they say is all we shall

get, & it must extend over 3 years. They make special reference to N. Carolina schools & missionary work, & yet we have always expected to aid

Dr. Earner with a liberal part, & he knows I feel a deep personal interest in his work. Our Com. was only waiting to get money from the Quaker City, as as to start their work with the year ^{especially as the} ~~the~~ ^{White Society} that just sent \$1000.

Those who have had the care of other people's money in work like this know that they want to see results, & these are only generally known through printed reports. My wish was to aid Dr. Earner in this way, so that his work might be established on a permanent basis with a regular income. We were so often asked for a printed report that I was
