

Report of Dr J. D. Garner

Marionville, Tennessee, 4th Mo. 25th 1878.

The work that I shall report has not been carried on entirely by the means furnished by the Baltimore Association, as I have received help from other sources, and cannot make out a separate report for each donation.

Since last Ninth Month (which is the beginning of our school year) I have had from fifty to one hundred scholars in schools under my charge, fifty being the least number at any one time, and one hundred being the greatest: the average for the whole time being seventy two. Thirty of this number have been furnished with books; forty have been helped to clothing, twenty of them being clothed entirely. Twenty two were helped to board. Twenty five have been in training for teaching during the present school year, some of whom are now teaching; the others are still in training. I have at this time R. D. Cophock, J. N. Parker, C. L. Snyder, Hannah Rinno & George Lupton under my employ, two of them receiving their entire pay through me, the others getting a small portion from those whom they teach.
