Dear friend

Having been compelled to defer my visit to Tennessee a few days, by the floods in Virginia, I have received thy letter of the 19th with the statistical report, which is very satisfactory. Please supply the deficiencies by memoranda, & I will enter them on the tables as to make it complete. Snow Hill, Sylva Academy & Wakulla have made no report at all. Hickory Grove & Cedar Grove with 30 or more Friend children apiece have had only 2 1/2 mos. of school & not a dollar contributed by either Friends. They are very backward in striving to secure for their children the blessings of education. The amount paid to Balt. Acc. to Woodland Academy should be \$125 instead of \$100. I enclose Memorandum of amount, & the dates thereof: by comparing the total with thy statistical table, there appears to be \$14.87 in hands not yet paid out. Am I right?
