At a Stated Meeting for Sufferings held in Baltimore 12th mo. 18th 1876. present 9 members.

The Committee on Indian Affairs reported that Francis T. King, one of their members had attended the last Meeting of the Associated Executive Committee held at Cincinnati, 11th mo. 22nd 1876. & that the work was in a satisfactory condition. They were continued.

This Meeting was informed that Balt^o Yearly Meeting had appointed Francis White to fill the vacancy in that Meeting's representation in this, occasioned by the death of our friend Miles White. His name was decided to be entered on our list of Members.

John C. Thomas, Francis T. King and Dr. Carey were appointed to propose a suitable mode of preserving the record of this and other meetings and report to a future Meeting.

At a Stated Meeting for Sufferings held in Balt^o 3rd Month 17th 1877 - present 11 members. We have at this time the acceptable Company of Stanley Pumphrey of England. This Meeting instituted in in the year 1778 as a "Meeting for Sufferings" is now by the Authority of the Yearly Meeting of 1876 to be called the Representative Meeting of Baltimore Yearly Meeting, (see Discipline revised in 1876. Page 46).

The Com^{tee} on Indian Affairs reported that the Associated Executive Com^{tee} is expected to meet in Baltimore 4th day. 24th mo. 11th 1877 - Dr. Nicholson has had an interview with Carl Schurz the incoming Secy of the Interior. The Com^{tee} was continued. Francis T. King reported that the Com^{tee} appointed to propose a suitable mode of preserving the records of this & our other Meetings recommended the depositing said records in a box to be kept in the Vault of the Safe Deposit Co. of Balt^o at an annual expense of Five Dollars; which was approved and the Com^{tee} continued to perfect the arrangement. The subject of Education at the South was introduced to the Meeting & a paragraph of Presd^t Hayes's inaugural address was read recommending National Legislative Aid in behalf of Education in the Southern States. Francis T. King, Dr. Carey, John C. Thomas, Caleb Windsor, Mrs B. Crenshaw & Francis White were appointed to take the whole subject under their care & expound the views of this Meeting to the President & by Memorizing Congress or otherwise as they may deem proper & report to a future Meeting. The Com^{tee} appointed to have the new book of Discipline printed reported that 1000 copies had been printed and 500 bound at a net cost of \$230. They proposed that the book be sold to our members and others at 30 cents - a copy - which is less than cost. The report was accepted and the Com^{tee} adjourned to the stated time in 10th mo next.
