It is the opinion of the Board that a sale should be made provided the purchase price be not lower than \$45,000^(net), even tho' there is some opposition to the sale on the part of a portion of our membership. It is to be understood that there shall be no restriction as to the use of the property.

Another minute was passed stating that, if and when the sale be consummated, the proceeds therefrom ~~shall~~ may be devoted to the purchase and maintenance of a home for Friends in the Washington area.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.
