The regular annual meeting of the Permanent Board (Homewood) was held this date, ten members being present.

The only business to come before the members was the Insurance Report.

In general these reports were acceptable.

The Clerk was instructed to write to Deer Creek asking if \$15,000 is actually adequate and to Fishertown also to inquire if \$13,000 is sufficient. Insurance. Deer Creek carries only \$20,000, which seems hardly sufficient to the Permanent Board, so the Clerk was instructed to write a similar letter to that meeting. Corinth reports \$8,000 coverage on the Meeting House and the Board instructed the Clerk to inquire if the Parsonage and other buildings are covered. The Clerk is to write again to Hopewell and Somerton, both of which meetings failed to send in reports.

The Permanent Board feels that by adjusting insurance so that a ^{small} premium falls ~~due~~ due each year the various meetings would find it easier to meet the premium payments than where the Insurance expires every five years, whereupon a larger amount of money has to be put out to meet this obligation.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.
