

and often blamed drinking for anti-social behaviour. He was sometimes firm but always kindly in dealing with those needing correction. His abilities brought him honors in the field of Juvenile and Domestic Relations. He was given a scroll in 1955 by the National Council of Juvenile Court Judges and the Virginia Council of Juvenile Court Judges, which read in part: "in recognition of his long and fruitful career as an outstanding jurist, whose unbounded wisdom, kindness and humility have given countless unfortunate and troubled children hope, faith and courage." He was twice elected President of the National Probation and Parole Association.
