from Maryland, and a large number of Women Friends appointed to unite with us therein; and after a solid attention, and a free communication of sentiments it was with much harmony concluded that the Quarterly Meetings of Warrington and Fairfax after this Yearly Meeting be considered as branches of the Yearly Meeting of Maryland; and that the Monthly Meetings of Duck Creek, Mother Kiln, and Deer Creek after receiving the extracts from the minutes of this Meeting through the Western Quarter, the two former unite with the Quarterly Meeting, on the Eastern Shore of Maryland, and that henceforth that Quarter report to this Meeting agreeably to the conclusion of the Yearly Meeting for Maryland; and that the latter in like manner to unite with the Quarterly Meeting held in Baltimore and to become a branch thereof. This arrangement was decided upon.

In 1790 the time of holding the Yearly Meeting was changed from the Sixth to the Tenth month.

In the year 1812 Ohio Yearly Meeting was established as the following minute shews. 10th month 12th.- 16th. 1812. The Committee appointed to unite with women Friends in the further consideration of this interesting subject of a Yearly Meeting being held in the state of Ohio, report that we have several times met, and had the company of several brethren of the Yearly Meetings of Philadelphia and Virginia, and believe that in our deliberations we have been favored with a degree of solemnity under which we are free to propose that the Quarterly Meetings west of the Alleghany Mountains within the verge of this Yearly Meeting be at full liberty to convene together at Short Creek on the 3rd. day of the 8th . month next in the capacity of a Yearly Meeting agreeable to their prospect, and deliver as expressed in their reports to the Meeting last year.
