

No. 1. \$100- for the education of Cyrus P. Frazer of No. 62 at Haverford College. - \$200 having been provided from other sources.

No. 2. - \$90 for the education of Lillie Thompson of Deer Creek, Md at West Town for one term.

No. 3. - \$80. - for the education of Bettie Bradshaw of Black Creek, Southampton Co. Va one term at New Garden, N. C.

No. 4. - \$100 for the salary of a teacher in Charles Co. Md for four or five months, provided her board is arranged for by families in the neighborhood.

No. 5. - Balto. Assn. of Friends to aid them in educational work in No. Co. \$150.

No. 6. - Piney Woods Quarterly Mtg. School \$100.

No. 7. - Dr. J. D. Garner's work in Tenn \$100.

An application from J. Oliver, Agt. to pay for a cold school house in Richmond Va was declined on the ground of the prior claims of the cold population of Balto.

The above reports were adopted, with the understanding that the appropriation recommended by the Book Committee was granted on condition that the names of the books and tracts distributed should hereafter be reported to the Board.

An application from Friends Sewing Society was received, for aid with which to purchase materials for garments; and \$50 was donated to same.

It was resolved to donate \$25 towards the gratuitous distribution of the Informer.

An application from W. L. Chase for an appropriation to aid in building a meeting house in Clay Co Iowa, was declined on the ground of not coming within the power of the Board.

On motion of Jos P. Elliott, \$50 was donated to the Md Bible Society.

The Meeting then adjourned Miles White, Jr. Secy.

At a Monthly Meeting of the Miles White Beneficial Society held 2nd Month 11th 1878, Francis White, Pres. F. J. King, Leabt. Winslow, Jos P. Elliott, Jas. Cary, and Miles White, Jr. were present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and adopted.

A note was received from A. C. Thomas, Secty, stating that the Charles Co. School had not been established, and the appropriation therefor not needed.

The Committee on Books and Tracts presented a report, dated 2nd Mo. 11th 1878, recommending the following appropriations, viz.,

To the Md Prisoners Aid Society for the distribution of the Sunday Magazine amongst inmates of Md Penitentiary \$100.
To Home of the Friendless for Hookus Book of Nature & other Books \$50.
To Bible classes of Hampden Presbyterian Church \$25.
To Alice Brooks for Books for Mother Meeting on Bulbul Hill \$25.
To Missionary Comtee of Balto. Yearly Mtg for Books for distribution \$25.
To Friends Sabbath School for a Library (not to exceed) \$150.

The report was accepted and the appropriation ordered.

The Committee on Charity presented a report, dated 12th

Month 21st 1877, recommending the following appropriations,

To the Home for Fallen Women of Baltimore \$100.
To Sophia Hopkins & Harriet Nightingale, each, \$25.

The Donations were granted and Treasurer instructed to pay them.

An application was received from the Building Comtee of Deer Creek (Harford Co.) Meeting House asking for an appropriation of \$200 towards the completion of the House. After being fully discussed, the amount was appropriated.

An application from Julia Valentine for an appropriation, to aid in erecting a Meeting House, at Cummerville, was declined.

The Meeting then on motion adjourned
