

of the amounts distributed, \$1400 was for charitable objects, \$900 for Educational purposes, and \$1170 for the dissemination of Books and Tracts.

The Funds, at our last Annual report were invested in a 5% City of Baltimore Loan. That Loan has been paid off, and the money invested in \$95,000 of U. S. 6% Bonds, at a cost of \$100,951<sup>30</sup>/<sub>100</sub>.
