Of the amounts distributed \$1120 was for charitable objects, \$1765 for Educational Purposes, and \$165 for the dissemination of Books and Tracts.

The Funds at our last Annual Report were invested in \$95,000 U. S. 6% Bonds: \$70,000 of these have been called in, and paid off by the U. S. Government, and the money has been invested in \$51,000, 5% U. S. Bonds of 1881, at a cost of \$52,936.75, and \$20,000 in 4% U. S. Bonds, at par, which with the remaining \$25,000, 6% Bonds makes a total of \$96,000 invested in Government Securities.
