An appropriation of \$200 was made to the Mexican Mission of Indiana Yearly Meeting \$100 to be used for publication purposes and \$100 for general expenses.

The sum of \$25 was appropriated for education of Isaac Jones at New Market, Tenn. as requested by John Parker.

The Finance Committee reported that the money loaned on collateral security had been drawing 3% interest up to Aug. 15th from which date until Sept 20th it was drawing 4%, since which time it has again been drawing 5% interest.

The Meeting then adjourned.
