"Whereas this Board has with deep regret heard of the death of our Co-Trustee James Carey, therefore be it Resolved that, We desire to place on record some expression of the loss our Society has sustained in his death.

He manifested a deep interest in all the objects of the Society and was most conscientious in the discharge of his duties as a Trustee. Especially did his heart go out in sympathy for the poor and the distressed who needed help, as also for the young who were struggling to obtain an education.

All classes of need and suffering had in him a sympathetic friend who was anxious to extend to them some practical relief.

We feel that we have lost in him a valuable member of our Board, whose place it will be difficult to fill.

A report was received from the Woman's Industrial Exchange, showing the fund granted by this Society to be intact.
