

The following Report was ordered to be forwarded to Baltimore Yearly Meeting of Friends, after having been signed by the President and Secretary

To Baltimore Yearly Meeting of Friends.
Dear Friends:

The Trustees of the Miles White Beneficial Society in conformity with its Act of Incorporation, submit the following statement of its operations for the past year.

In thus doing they are called upon to announce the great loss they have sustained in the deaths of their late co-Trustees James Carey and Dr. Caleb Winslow, both of whom were men of sterling integrity and kindly impulses, and manifested deep interest in all the objects for which this Society was founded. They were most conscientious in the discharge of their duties as Trustees, and their excellent practical judgment was most valuable to us in deciding our actions.

James Carey Jr and John Nicholson both of Baltimore have been elected to fill the vacancies thus caused in the Board.

Since the last report \$2000 of Northern Pacific Railroad 1st Mortgage 6 per cent. Bonds, held by the Trustees, have been called for redemption by the Company and redeemed for \$2200. To replace which, as well as to offset any future decline of premiums on securities held, the Trustees have purchased \$3000 of Charlotte Columbia and Augusta Railroad 1st Mortgage extended 5 per cent. Bonds at a cost of \$3167⁵⁰.

Otherwise there has been no change made in the investments.

Interest to the amount of \$5527²⁵ has been received, and \$4765²² has been distributed as follows: \$2797⁵⁰ for Charitable objects; \$1303²⁰ for educational purposes; \$365⁰⁰ for dissemination of books and tracts; and \$280⁰⁰ has been advanced to 5 deserving persons as loans for educational purposes.
