The Finance Committee reported that one Northern Pacific RR 1st Mortgage Bond had since the last meeting been called for redemption and paid and that they had purchased \$1500 of Charlotte Columbia and Augusta RR 1st Mortgage extended 5% Bonds at 105 1/4 and the action of the Committee was unanimously ratified.

A report was received from Cedar Grove Preparative Meeting School N.C. showing that the \$75 granted it last year had been used to pay the tuition of 9 pupils for entire term of 8 months and part tuition of 3 others.

A report from Aurora Academy Rich Square N.C. stated that the \$50 granted it last year was used to prolong the school term of 25 needy children.

A detailed report was received from White Plains Academy N.C. giving names of students assisted and stating the amount each received and showing that the \$50 given it had been used to assist 21 students all of whom except two were female children.

A report from Belvidere Academy N.C. stated that the \$100 granted it had been used to partially pay the tuition of 18 children.

A letter was received from Mary V Hare stating that she could not go to Guilford College N.C. this term, and inquiring if the \$50 appropriated at last meeting for her could be used next summer. The Board gave its consent to this.

Richd. C. Congdon notified the Board that he had entered Lehigh University and that the \$1000 authorized 1st Mo. 1st 1896 to be loaned him would be needed.

Jesse H. Brown informed the Board that he had finished his course at Westtown School and had needed to borrow only \$20 of the \$100 authorized 10th Mo 9th 1894 to be loaned to him. He desired to know if the balance would be loaned him to enable him to take a business course in Phila.

The Board declined to make the loan, and the Secty was requested to inform him that he could procure such instruction at Y. Men's Assoc.

The Educational Committee to whom was referred the application of Mt Olivet School at Eagletown N.C. for a donation did not advise that it be granted and no appropriation was made.
