A report was received from Southland College Ark. showing that \$75 appropriated last year had been used to educate 12 girls and 1 boy.

A report was received from Womens Industrial Exchange purporting to show present state of special funds heretofore granted it, as well as working of same during past year. The Society was instructed to act for a more definite statement.

An application was received from Maryville Normal and Preparatory School asking for an increased appropriation to it this year. It was referred to Educational Committee for investigation.

The Womens Industrial Exchange submitted two reports showing the workings of as well as the present condition of the two funds to which this Society has contributed viz the Plain Sewing Fund and the Fancy Work Fund. The Society was instructed to signify the Boards appreciation of work done.

An application from Sallie W. Copeland asking aid for her brother Foster Copeland to attend Guilford College was received and the sum of \$15 granted him.

An application was received from Evangeline Martin asking an appropriation to Scholarship Fund of Pacific College Oregon which was declined.
