The Finance Committee reported that one Northern Pacific RR 1st Mortgage Bond had since the last meeting been called for redemption and paid, and that they had purchased \$1500 of Northern Pacific Railroad Prior Lien 100 year Gold Bonds at 89 1/4 in July and the action of the Committee was unanimously ratified.

The Committee also recommended in view of the fact that the N. Pacific 1st Mtg 6% Bonds are likely to be called for redemption more rapidly in future, and that there now offers to give in exchange for every \$1000 of these Bonds \$1320 of the Prior Lien 100 year 4% Bonds that the 16 Bonds now held by this Society be so exchanged.

The recommendation was agreed to and the Treasurer authorized to make the exchange.

A report was received from Belvidere Academy N.C. showing that the \$100 granted

last year had been used to educate 24 scholars. Cedar Grove Preparative School reported that the \$75 granted it had been used for tuition of 11 children for 8 months.

The \$200 granted to Maryville Normal & Preparatory School Tenn. was used for tuition of 10 students.

The \$50 granted to Aurora Academy Rich Square N.C. was used to extend the length of time the school was open so that the 61 scholars of whom 38 are friends were benefitted. Total length of school only 5 months.

White Plains Academy N.C. used the \$50 granted it, to assist 23 students.

Southland College Ark. reported that of the \$75 granted it, \$60 had been used for 6 students and \$15 in small sums for day tuition of children living near the school.

John C. Thomas rendered a report showing the manner in which he had expended the \$50 given him for relief of poor at Federal Hill.
