Cedar Grove Prep Mtg School reported that \$75 granted it had been used to assist 19 students.

The \$75 granted to Anna Academy Rich Square N.C. was used to lengthen the term of school, which was held for 7 months with an enrollment of 83, and average daily attendance of 50%.

A letter was received from the Clerk of Wilmington, O. yearly Meeting stating that it continues to feel a deep interest in Maryville Prep & Normal School and had made an appropriation towards carrying it on, and requests that this Society continue for next year the assistance heretofore extended to the School.

An application for assistance to Galikin Valley School N.C. was received and declined.
