Mayville Normal & Prep School gave names of 55 children who were assisted to 207 1/2 months school.

Cedar Grove Prep. Htg. School reported that it was held 8 mos. with an enrollment of 60 of whom 31 were friends, average attendance 35 1/2. County paid \$200, Palmer \$52 30.

A report was received from Southland College showing that 16 students were assisted by the \$75 appropriated by us.

John E. Thomas made a satisfactory report of the manner in which he had distributed among poor at Federal Hill the \$50 granted him.

A report was received from The Women's Industrial Exchange showing that funds granted it for Plain Sewing are in fact.

The Finance Committee reported that they had examined the Treasurers account and found it correct and supported by proper vouchers, and that all the securities are on hand in safe deposit vaults.

The Treasurer reported that Jesse A. Brown had received \$200 of the \$350 authorized 5 mo 3, 1898 to be loaned to him and had given his note therefor.
