Baltimore Tenth month 7th 1901.

A report was received from Cedar Grove Preparatory Mtz. School stating that the \$75 granted if had been used to pay entire tuition of 6 pupils and to lengthen the school term, so that it lasted 7 1/2 months, that the State paid \$200 & the balance \$40 - Enrollment 63 of whom 27 were friends. Average attendance 42.

Annapolis Academy (now called High School) reported that it continued 7 months average attendance \$30 average attendance while sum. grant made by this Society \$38 1/2. Proposed for this year is that school will be larger.

A report was received from Maryville Normal School Tenn. stating that the school property had been sold to directors of the public school and would no longer be carried on as heretofore and no further aid would be needed. During the past year \$200 had been received from this Society, \$50 from Wilmington Yearly Meeting and \$100 from sale of old furniture and that \$265 70 had been used to aid 63 students (the first 41 smallest amount \$200).

John C. Thomas made a report showing use made of \$50 granted him last November for relief of poor at Federal Hill.
