The Treasurer submitted the following Special Report of the Treas.
 To the Trustees of the Miles White Beneficial Society
 Baltimore March 1. 1904

The Treasurer reports the necessity of reporting to the Board that the books of the Society embracing the Ledger, Cash Book and Check Book in custody of the Treasurer and which for the past twenty years had been kept in the Iron safe of Elliott Brothers, were entirely destroyed by fire in the general conflagration of Feb. 7th & 8th with other contents of the safe.

He had removed from the safe, before it was reached by the fire, the Bank Deposit Book, the Cash Book containing the Notes for outstanding loans and Collateral Life Insurance Policies, and the keys to the Safe Deposit Box, together with some books and papers belonging to Elliott Bros.

He will be able to replace the Cash Book entries made since 10th mo. 1st 1903
