At a Monthly Meeting of the Miles White Beneficial Society held 5th mo 2nd 1904, there were present John Nicholson, Francis J. White, William L. Elliott, Francis A. White, James Carey Jr and Miles White Jr.

A report was received from Charity Mission School showing that it had been held four months with an enrollment of 55 of whom 17 were females. The average attendance was 25, the parents paid \$40 and the Society \$50. The school is under care of Westfield Mo. City.

A report was received from White Plains Academy stating that owing to smallpox the school closed a month earlier than usual and therefore only \$36.75 of the \$50 appropriated had been used. 57 students were assisted. advice was desired as to whether to return the balance of \$13.25 or to retain it and use it for next term in August. The latter was authorized.

Augusta Academy presented the names of 22 students towards the tuition of whom \$75 was desired. The amount was appropriated.
