Upon the affirmative vote of five members of the Board By-Law V was amended so as to read "on the first Second-day of each month," etc., instead of "on the first Third-day of each month," etc.

The copies of the last issue of By-Laws in hands of Secretary having been destroyed in the conflagration of last July, he was authorized to have a new ~~issue~~ printed.

A report was received from Southmont College, Ark. showing that the \$75 appropriated last year had been used to assist 9 deserving students. The enrollment was about 175.

A report was received from Edin Grove Preparative Meeting School stating that the \$75 appropriated last year had been used to pay entire tuition of 1 pupil and to lengthen school term to 7 months, Enrollment 66 of whom 29 were Friends. County paid \$205 and patronage \$100.

A report from White Plains School N.C. stated that the balance of last year's appropriation of \$50 amounting to \$12.22 had benefited 50 children.

A report received from Belvidere Academy N.C. showed that 53 children had received aid from the \$100 appropriated last year.

Frienderville Academy Tenn. reported the largest enrollment for many years viz 117 pupils of whom 53 were Friends, there were 3 teachers, and \$100 appropriated by this Society, \$100 by Wilmington Yearly Meeting and \$46 from Baltimore were used to run the whole school.

Information was sent that the \$28 given to Rocky River School N.C. had enabled it to be continued two months, attendance 32. Patronage paying balance of the \$50.

Rocky River School N.C. reported that the \$50 appropriated last year to it enabled the school to continue 7 1/2 weeks with an enrollment of 68, and to pay entire tuition of 4 girls.
