That West Union School of Rich Square, N. C. used our appropriation of \$100.00 towards school work, ^{being improved} and that a Woman's Betterment Association, recently organized, was aiding the School. That Up River Friends School of North Carolina used our appropriation of \$100.00, in connection with a similar amount by local patrons, in extending the School year to eight months; that they had employed two teachers throughout the year. That Cedar Grove Preparative Meeting School used our appropriation of \$100.00 ^{for school purposes & they had} to improve the condition of the School; that the attendance was larger than heretofore, 60 students being enrolled, of whom 32 were Friends and that a Woman's Betterment Association had been organized which was working with the School; that new equipment had been added, and that there was harmony existing between the patrons, teachers and
