

SECRETARY'S REPORT-

The Secretary reported that there are no outstanding unpaid appropriations which are due.

From reports received from various schools, it is shown that Belvidere Academy used our appropriation of \$200. toward paying the tuition of a Friend, and toward the teachers' salaries. The term of the school was eight and a half months.

That Up River Friends School used our appropriation of \$100. toward paying the salaries of the teachers; during the fall term of six weeks, seventy-five pupils were enrolled, and during the spring term of eight weeks, forty-five were enrolled; between the fall and the spring terms, there was a Public School of three months.

That Cedar Grove Preparative Meeting School used our appropriation of \$100. as follows: Full tuition for one student for seven months of the term, and another for four months. The remainder was combined with funds received from various sources, to carry on an eight months' term of school. The School is under the management of a Principal and two assistants, all of whom are Friends.

That White Plains School used our appropriation of \$50. toward paying the tuition of 59 students during the spring term.

That Guilford Graded School used our appropriation of \$100. toward lengthening the school year; without such aid, it would have been impossible last year to conduct the school six months. The increased attendance has necessitated the employment of four teachers, and last year, all four were graduates of colleges.
