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REPORT OF THE SECRETARY

Secretary's Report-

The Secretary reported that there are no outstanding unpaid appropriations.

From reports received from various schools, it is shown that Up River Friends School used our appropriation of \$100.00 toward paying the salaries of the teachers. During the fall term of six weeks, seventy-three pupils were enrolled; there was also a spring term of eight weeks. The assistance of our Society has brought returns of one hundred fold to both school and church at Up River.

That White Plains School used our appropriation of \$50.00 toward paying the tuition of sixty-eight students during the spring term. That Guilford Graded School used our appropriation of \$100.00 toward paying the teachers' salaries, which enabled the school to be operated for a longer term. The school is growing year by year and

last year, several hundred dollars were spent in repairs, notwithstanding which, the school was still conducted six months.

That Guilford College used our appropriation of \$500.00 in aid of thirty-seven needy students.

That Friendsville Academy used our appropriation of \$50.00 toward maintaining a low rate of tuition. During the term of 1912-1913, one hundred and twenty-eight students were enrolled.

That West Union School used our appropriation of \$100.00 to aid in extending the term after the public school closed.

That Corinth Academy used our appropriation of \$200.00 toward paying the teacher's salary.

That our appropriation of \$150. to the American Friend was used to extend the circulation of the Paper to those members of Baltimore and North Carolina Yearly Meetings, not subscribers, and also to others.
