THE SECRETARY REPORTED THAT OUR APPROPRIATION OF \$500. TO Guilford College was used to aid 27 students, and as often as possible, this aid was loaned to the students, to be returned by them to the College, to be reloaned to other students.

\$100. was appropriated to Guilford Graded School to prolong its term. \$100. was appropriated to Up River Friends School. The length of the term was extended to four months and nineteen days and one hundred and twenty pupils were enrolled. The patrons paid \$434. and \$574. was spent, and 75% of children belonging to Eastern Quarterly Meeting were in this school.

A special appropriation of \$200. was made to Belvidere Academy, which was enabled thus to carry through its school year, since which time, the school has been closed as a Meeting School, and the building has been sold to the County Board of Education.

\$100. to West Union School of Rich Square, N. C., which was used to pay part tuition of the scholars, thus prolonging the term.

\$50. to White Plains School to assist in paying the teachers' salary.

\$50. to Friendsville Academy, Tenn., to carry on the school temporarily, as the building had been burned down. For this year, the Friends' School Board has been combined with the County Board, and they are considering building a joint High School. Their work has been endorsed by Wilmington Yearly Meeting, under which circumstances, we promised them an appropriation of \$100. for this year's work.

\$100. to Blue Ridge Mission, which has been changed to Blue Ridge Academy and is said to be doing excellent work.
