

The Secretary reported that Guilford College used our appropriation of \$500. to aid 24 students, the various amounts being loaned to the students, when possible, which amounts are to be returned by them to the College.

Guilford Graded School used our appropriation of \$100. to help defray expenses of improvements and towards the salary of one additional teacher.

Up River Friends School used our appropriation of \$150. to help along the term of the school, which began January 29th and closed May 21st - a term of four months. 120 pupils were enrolled, of whom 75% were Friends.

Our appropriation of \$200. to Corinth Academy was used towards the salary of the Principal, C. Emmett Trueblood, in the upper school; the County and patrons are paying all expenses of the lower school. Our appropriation of \$150. to The American Friend was used in sending an equivalent number of copies to members of Baltimore and Carolina Meetings, not otherwise subscribers. The Paper has not yet sufficient subscribers to be self-supporting.

Belvidere Academy used our appropriation of \$150. to extend the term from six months to eight months.

West Union School of Rich Square, N. C. used our appropriation of \$100. to pay part of the tuition of the pupils.

White Plains School used our appropriation of \$50. to assist in paying the teachers' salaries.

Blue Ridge Academy has been placed under the charge of Surry Quarterly Meeting of North Carolina Yearly Meeting.
