

SECRETARY'S REPORT-

Our principal Educational Appropriations were as follows:

GUILFORD COLLEGE, \$500. to aid twenty-four students, part in loans to be repaid the College-

GUILFORD GRADED SCHOOL, \$100. to aid in extending the term-

CORINTH ACADEMY, \$200. towards paying principal's salary in High School, the primary School being taken over by the County, which has assumed all expense and abolished tuition fees.

FRIENDSVILLE ACADEMY, Tenn., \$50. towards general expenses; school attendance, 146- Wilmington Yearly Meeting contributing \$100.

UP RIVER FRIENDS SCHOOL, N. C. \$100. with 75 Friends enrolled, 4 teachers and eight months term, wish continued appropriation to assist in High School work.

WHITE PLAINS SCHOOL, N. C. \$50. Had 6½ months term and six weeks successful summer school, three teachers. With our appropriation wish seven months' term and few additional Friends in attendance.

WEST UNION SCHOOL OF RICH SQUARE, N. C. \$100. Built a new \$1100. School House last year, eleven Friends enrolled, six months term. Hope to have seven months term this year.

Our BOOK & TRACT & CHARITABLE appropriations were about the same as heretofore, our appropriation of \$150. to The American Friend being used for a similar number of subscriptions selected by us, to those not otherwise subscribing. As the Paper is not yet self-supporting, this subscription was needed and helpful.
