A regular monthly meeting of the trustees of the Miles White Beneficial Society was held in room 606, Keyser Bldg., Baltimore. Those present were Dr. Randolph Winslow, James Carey, Jr., John N. Parker and R.L. Cary. In the absence of the president, on motion of John N. Parker, Dr. Winslow was elected chairman.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

On recommendation of the Educational Committee, an appropriation of \$100 was made to J. Hoge Ricks, to be used toward the tuition of J. Hoge Ricks, Jr., at Westtown School; and a loan of \$300 to William A. Wolff for expenses during his study at the University of Pennsylvania was authorized. A request for \$25 from the Lord's Day Alliance on account of publication of a pamphlet was not approved. A request from Sara H. Hoge for \$25 to be used by the national W.C.T.U. in advocating naval disarmament was not approved.
