Holmes school has not been satisfactory during the past year so they will not ask for the \$50 that was appropriated to them -

Some of the Lower Virginia children are staying away from school because they have no books so the Committee decided to appropriate some money to buy books, the secretary being directed to write to Deborah Peltow to find out what books are needed & what the cost will be -

\$14 was appropriated to Matilda Harris for her daughter's tuition at the Public School in Curwensville. \$2 a month being needed for seven months.
