At a meeting of the Yearly Meeting's Committee on Education held 11th mo 15th 1898 in the lower room of the Meeting house the question of Corinth School was fully discussed - Some of the patrons of the school expressed a desire to avail themselves of the public school funds & wished assistance to continue such a school after the regular term closes - The Committee did not see the need of two schools in the neighborhood and it was decided that the present school at Corinth should be put in charge of a committee appointed by lower monthly meeting - With this understanding the Committee appropriated \$250 towards the expenses of the school part of which should go towards the salary of the teacher and part to help pay the tuition of the children unable to pay their own expenses -
